

Information and Equipment list for Key Stage 1 (Years 1 - 2)

General Information

In KS1 the children stand in their designated class line in the mornings ready to go in. The class teacher will come out to collect the class. This is an opportunity for any messages or letters to be passed on, such as if your child is being picked up by somebody different.

If your child is late they must come to the school office to register. The doors to the playgrounds are locked after all the classes have entered.

At the end of the day the children will be sent out through the door closest to their classrooms to the adult collecting them.

Equipment List

Children will need the following:

- School uniform
- P.E. kit in a named bag
Please ensure their P.E. kit is left in school from Monday to Friday. P.E. is a requirement of the National Curriculum and it is very important children bring the appropriate kit. If your child cannot take part in a P.E. lesson please send a written explanation to the class teacher. Without a note children will be expected to take part in the lesson.
- Book bag (available from the school office)
- A coat (preferably water resistant with a hood), gloves and warm hat
- Sun hat (and sunscreen applied before school)
- The children in KS1 also attend Forest School on a regular basis where they will explore a wooded area and the natural world. They will need to have a pair of wellies in school all year round. During cold weather warm clothing will also be required.

Swimming – Summer Term only

- Costume (for boys this must be trunks not shorts, for girls this must be one piece)
- Towel
- Swimming hat (available from the school office)

Please put your child's name on all items.

Snack

We provide the children with a healthy snack each day (fruit or vegetable). Please provide a named transparent water bottle filled with fresh plain water each day. Drinking plenty of water aids children's learning.
