Dear Parents and Carers,

As the term draws to a close, we would like to say a big thank you for all your hard work supporting children at home this term. The engagement from the children and the quality of work submitted has been really good and we are hopeful that this should help to mitigate some of the loss of time in school. We would also like to thank all the families and children who responded to our survey. The feedback was very positive and some excellent suggestions were made of how we could further improve the remote learning provision. We are looking at changes that we can make whilst continuing to ensure that our approach aligns with research on Remote Learning from the Educational Endowment Foundation and researchers such as Doug Lemov. Here are some of the changes that we will be making-

- Google Meets and PE- Many parents/carers and children were very positive about the Google Meets and felt that they were having a positive impact. We will be adding in some extra Google Meets and also we will be giving children more opportunities to be physically active with Karate lessons on Monday afternoons and weekly PE challenges from Mr Nutt.
- Feedback - KS2 teachers have been ensuring that children know where to find the feedback they are giving and also making sure that children have opportunities to respond to teacher comments.
- Level of work- Teachers have been working hard to ensure that there is challenge and support for children who are at different stages with their learning. You will see some extra tasks available to support those children who may be finding the learning difficult and challenges for children who are ready for the next step.

We appreciate this is a really difficult time for people, and that juggling support for home-learning with working from home is a real challenge. Just like you, we are really looking forward to the day when normal schooling can resume, but in the meantime thank you again for everything you're doing. We hope you will also join us in thanking all of the staff who have been working harder than ever this term, adapting to new ways of working, and as always doing everything they can to support our children educationally and emotionally.
